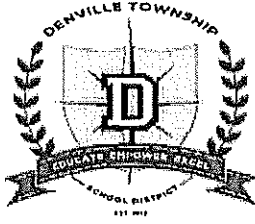

I hope you and your child are enjoying the conclusion to a productive school year. Throughout the year, students had many opportunities to read and listen to books read aloud during the school day. Your support for those same reading experiences at home will help your child continue to grow as a reader, writer, thinker, and learner.

As you plan for the summer, please consider the literacy experiences your child will have in these months away from the classroom. Book Bingo is a great way to keep up the learning and the fun! Use the board on the back of this page to earn bingo (or more than one bingo) as you read, write, and talk about books together this summer.

In addition to local booksellers, the Denville Public Library is a valuable, and free, local resource. If you need help selecting books, do not hesitate to ask the librarian!

For those of you planning travel this summer, consider going beyond the bookshelves and print pages to include audio books in your child's experience. These are available on CD or on iTunes (ready to go right onto an iPod). While audio books are not replacement for reading, they are a wonderful supplement, especially when experienced with a copy of the actual book.

ASSIGNMENT:

Students entering grades 1 and 2 are in different stages of learning to read. It's okay to read books aloud or together as you complete the squares on the bingo board. Please initial in each square as your child completes it. Children will bring their boards back to school in September, and share experiences with their classmates.

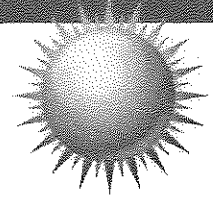

Summer Fun with Reflex!



Dear Parents/Guardians,

Help your child avoid the “summer slide” and encourage them to use their Reflex account this summer! Reflex is an online, game-based program that helps students build fast and effortless recall of math facts. Research has shown that quick recall of math facts is critical for future success in mathematics.

- Students are encouraged to login to **Reflex** math through their student portal at least **3 times a week** and strive for the “**green light**” each time.
- Your child can utilize the **Reflex** math program from any device with internet access throughout the summer.
- **Reflex** helps students of all ability levels to develop fluency with their basic facts in addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.
- **Reflex** continuously monitors your child’s performance to create an optimal experience for them.
- Parents can easily monitor their child’s progress by creating a *Free Reflex Parent Account*. Use the instructions on the right to Create your Parent Account.

Create a Free Parent Account

To set up an account, you will need your child’s Reflex login information: (teacher’s Reflex Username, the name of the Reflex Class, and your child’s Reflex Password).

1. Go to reflexmath.com/parent
2. Follow The onscreen instructions to create your free account
3. Go to www.reflexmath.com/reports
4. Once you are logged, follow the instructions to add your child.
5. Once registered, launch the parent account at www.reflexmath.com/reports to log into your new account. Enter your Username (your email address) and Password and click Submit.

UPDATED Information about the Green Light!

- ✓ When the Green Light illuminates in the upper right hand corner, this indicates that the **Daily Usage Requirement** has been met.
- ✓ If students do not reach the Green Light in their first session of the day, they can login later to build on the progress they made earlier in the day.
- ✓ Typically, students reach the green light in **15 minutes** of concentrated use. Students can choose to continue working after the Green Light illuminates.
- ✓ **New games** are unlocked after a certain number of Green-Light sessions.
